I would like to a moment to give a brief update on the actions that Presbyterian Manor is taking in regards to the Coronavirus (also known as COVID-19).

Presbyterian Manor and the House of Hope's number one priority is the safety of our residents and staff.

COVID-19 has not been diagnosed in the main building apartment complex, the Perkins-Prothro Health Care Center or the House of Hope campus. However, for our residents' safety and in compliance with Governor Abbott's directive to nursing home facilities, we are suspending all visitation to these buildings. To our independent living apartments in the main building, only individuals necessary for the health and/or well-being of the resident is allowed due to its connected, communal setting.

We are monitoring this situation closely and have already implemented steps to help prevent the spread in our community. We are in close contact with the Department of Health and Human Services and CDC. If there should be any confirmed reports, we will implement stringent infection control and isolation procedures immediately.
